*The Architectural Team earns prestigious industry awards for new residential redevelopments*

The multi-family residential properties, Avalon Danvers and Avalon at Lexington Hills, received recognition by the Builders Association of Greater Boston, the Multifamily Executive Magazine, and the National Association of Home Builders.

"We're honored to be lauded for our work in preserving the architectural integrity of historic properties. Avalon Danvers, a 433-unit residential property, involved the renovation of the historic Kirkbride building, which provided a stylistic template of Victorian-Gothic architecture to guide the construction of the new building's contemporary, yet understated design. The building serves as a unifying element of TAT's master plan, and the focal point for the organization of 11 new buildings, which define new landscape open spaces and brings historic context into balance on the site.

Avalon Danvers recently won a 2009 PRISM Award for *Best Rental Community "Silver"* from the Builders Association of Greater Boston; the *2009 Project of the Year in the Adaptive Reuse category* in the MFE Awards (Multifamily Executive magazine), and was also a finalist in the '*Best Community Site Plan*' category of the National Association of Home Builders Pillars of the Industry Awards.

Avalon at Lexington Hills, 387-unit residential property, involved redeveloping two historic buildings—a theatre, which now serves as the clubhouse/leasing center and is the focal point and hub for social activity of the community, and the former main hospital building. The TAT master plan arranges 10 new buildings formally

around these historic structures creating a diverse and unique neighborhood of lawns, gardens, and tree-lined streets - a pattern reminiscent of the original hospital campus.

Avalon at Lexington Hills recently won a *2009 PRISM Award for Best Rental Community "Gold"* from the Builders Association of Greater Boston, and was a finalist in the '*Best Clubhouse*' category of the National Association of Home Builders Pillars of the Industry Awards.

TAT has a long record of industry recognitions for its respectful approach to preserving historic buildings. This work stands as a testament to the firm's commitment to partner with its clients to revitalize under-utilized and often abandoned properties, while retaining the design elements that ranks the structure as historically and architecturally significant. While adaptive reuse is not a new trend, it is one that continues to provide economically viable solutions for developers who would otherwise have high-barriers of entry with new construction projects.
